

ABOUT MARTHA'S STORY – TODAY'S SERMON

In the sermon this morning I will speak, not as Pastor Ginny, but as a young woman of Jesus' time. This young woman as "Martha", so the sermon is called "Martha's Story." But this Martha is not the sister of Mary. This Martha is someone I "created" or, rather, she introduced herself to me.

It was during Lent one year, leading up to Holy Week, when I began to think about the people who knew Jesus, or knew about him, and who took risks to follow him. One of those people was the man who let Jesus and the disciples eat the Passover meal in his upper room. My friend Tom suggested that this was truly dangerous, especially since the authorities already were looking for ways to kill Jesus.

So, I wondered: who else took such risks? Who else does the Bible describe that knowingly helped Jesus, in spite of the danger to themselves or their families? That's how the door opened, and Martha walked through. She looked at me that day and said, *let me tell you about Jesus*. And the sermon was written. I'm not sure I wrote it; I've always felt God let Martha give it to me.

So today you will get to hear Martha's story.

As we come with Jesus into Jerusalem today, and as we follow him through this Holy Week, I invite you to read the Biblical accounts of what happened that week. Begin with Matthew 21 or Mark 11, or Luke 19, or John 12 and read to the end of each of those gospels; read a little each day and pray through the week with Jesus. Think about what it would have been like if you had been there.

This Triumphant Entry we call Palm Sunday, with crowds waving palms and shouting Hosanna, ends with crowds crying: Crucify Him! There is triumph and shame, delight and horror, sacrifice and victory. Martha invites us to think about what it was like, and to know Jesus in new and fresh ways this year, to see Jesus through her eyes.

Blessings to each and all as we walk this journey with our Lord.
